-Introspection = the tendencyto look inside his soul


-The tension between the REAL and the IDEAL (Streben) = man's desires are infinite and for the Infinite

6) ESCAPE INTO HISTORY, FOLKLORE and CLASSICISM (KEATS)


> "A thing of beauty is a joy forever" (Keats)



6) IMAGINATION:


source of the creative process

- •it allows the poet to recreate and modify the external world of experience
- poetry helps mankind to understand the Mystery beyond the Real and to bear the sorrow of life

- •"Imagination dissolves, diffuses, dissipates, in order to re-create (...) to idealize, to unify" (Coleridge)



•"And then my heart with pleasure fills,/ And dances with the daffodils" (Wordsworth)






3. THE NATURAL SUBLIME


